



CUYAHOGA COUNTY WESTSHORE TRAINING COVID PROTOCOL

We Ask You Visit Us at a Later Time if You Answer YES to Either Question Below:

- Do you have any of the following NEW symptoms within the last 2 to 5 days: fever, cough, trouble breathing, shortness of breath, wheezing, new chills, new muscle aches, sore throat, diarrhea, or new loss of smell or taste?
- OR Have you had prolonged, close contact with a person with confirmed COVID-19 in the past 14 days?

Persons scheduled to attend training who are experiencing symptoms of illness (i.e., fever, cough, or shortness of breath) or have been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID should reschedule the training.

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


